They hold meetings once a month to review books and to plan special teen activities. They also help the librarians in the Teen section at the Main and Harmony libraries. IRS members earn volunteer hours for the time they spend attending IRS meetings and working on library programs for teens.

You may qualify if you are:

- In 6th grade through 12th grade
- Male or female
- Tall enough to reach standard book shelves
- Of undetermined weight, but generally considered to be a "heavy reader"
- Known to frequent libraries, bookstores, and paperback racks of local emporiums
- Suffering from a reading addiction, and usually have one or two books with you at all times
- Guilty of ever reading by flashlight under the covers at night when you are supposed to be asleep
